MacRostie Chardonnay and Pinot Noir: A lesson in terroir – “What I love about this MacRostie Chard is the light touch that still delivers a swath of elegance and complexity. Flavors are rich but subtle and will not overwhelm the palate or what you are eating. The 2014 vintage uses oak judiciously — so you get some of the power and finesse but not the toast; you get the weight and mouthfeel, not the smoke. Aromas are delicate lime and pear, mandarin orange and fresh-baked whole-wheat bread. The palate has delicate fruit, crisp acidity, a broad mouthfeel. Like a ballerina on her toes.”
